Scholarship Requirements:

- Student must have an unweighted 3.0 GPA. This will be verified.

Your application will consist of:

- 1. The completed Scholarship Application Form
- 2. A one-page TYPED (size 12 font) essay with student's school ID number typed in upper right corner of the page. Essay topic shown below.

Essay Topic – Please tell the committee about a person or experience that you encountered at Sickles High School that most influenced your future goals.

The scholarship selection committee will be reviewing scholarships based on both content and grammar/spelling.

The application deadline is Friday, March 27, 2020. Please turn in your application to *the Success Center in Guidance* by the close of school. Late and/or incomplete applications will not be considered. For judging purposes, please **DO NOT** put your name on the form. We will use *Student Numbers* to identify the Scholarship applicants.

Winners will be required to submit a copy of their acceptance letter from the university/college they plan to attend to Sickles PTSA. Checks will be made payable directly to these schools. There will be one \$1,500 winner, one \$1,000 winner and three \$500 winners.
